**Resolution to Provide Free Menstrual Products in Female and Family Bathrooms At  
Lathrop**

**Submitted by: Lathrop Student Council**

**Be it resolved by the Alaska Association Of Student Governments that:**

- 1. Whereas**, there are approximately 1045 students enrolled at Lathrop High School, 47% whom are female;
- 2. Whereas**, as of 2014-2015, 39% of Lathrop students qualify for financial aid in the form of free or reduced price lunches;
- 3. Whereas**, it is estimated that a woman may spend over \$3000 on sanitary pads and tampons alone over the course of her lifetime;
- 4. Whereas**, time students take to find adequate menstrual products is time spent outside of the classroom, away from learning;
- 5. Whereas**, feminine hygiene products are currently available in the nurse's office, but the majority of students are uncomfortable requesting them;
- 6. Whereas**, discreet and easily accessible menstrual products will create an environment more conducive to learning;

**Therefore, be it resolved that the Alaska Association Of Student Governments supports that female and family bathrooms at Lathrop High School are supplied with free menstrual products.**
