Senior Free Period

Be it resolved by the Alaska Association of Student Governments,

1. **Whereas**, seniors at Delta High School are required to take five classes per semester, despite how many credits they need to graduate;
2. **Whereas**, at Delta High School a student is required to earn 22 credits to graduate;
3. **Whereas**, there are 6 periods in a day at Delta High School;
4. **Whereas**, to be eligible to play sports a student must be enrolled in at least two credit bearing classes per semester, that is, four classes per semester;
5. **Whereas**, students who are not participating in sports are still required to take 5 classes per semester;
6. **Whereas**, Seniors at Delta High School are only allowed to have their free periods during either 1st or 6th hour;

7. **Whereas**, To be eligible to graduate a senior must have at least 4.0 Language Arts credits, 3.0 Math credits, 3 Science credits, 2.5 Social Studies credits, 0.5 General Financial Literacy, 1.5 Art credits, 1.5 Fitness for Life credits, 0.5 Health credits, 0.25 Career Exploration Credits, 0.25 Driver's Education Credits, 0.5 Computer Technology Credits, and 1.0 Technology Education Credits;
8. **Whereas**, There are certain required classes that need to be taken before a DHS student can graduate;
9. **Whereas**, English I and II, US History and half a credit of AK History, Biology, Algebra, half a credit of PE and Health, and Fine Arts or Foreign Language are all required classes at Delta High School;
10. **Whereas**, Seniors at Ben Eielson High School, another 3A school in our region, do not have a free period limit;
11. **Whereas**, Seniors at DHS are unable to have jobs this year due to the "5 classes per semester" rule, even though they only need four or less credits to graduate;


Therefore be it resolved by the Alaska Association of Student Governments supports that Delta High School seniors be allowed more than one free period.
