

Alaska Association of Student Governments Resolution #16

Banning the Use of Single Use Plastic Straws in the Food Service Industry in the State of Alaska

Be it Resolved by the Alaska Association of Student Governments that:

- 1. **Whereas,** last year in the U.S., 390 million single use plastic straws were used and disposed of everyday;¹
- **2. Whereas,** a single plastic straw can take 200 years to decompose, and while doing so release toxins into the environment;²
- 3. **Whereas,** most recycling centers are unable to recycle plastic straws due to their size, causing further buildup of waste in landfills;³
- 4. **Whereas,** plastic straws make up 3.16% of ocean waste recovered worldwide, and 1% of ocean waste recovered in Alaska;⁴
- **5.** Whereas, the State of California has passed a bill limiting the use of plastic straws in full service restaurants;⁵
- **6.** Whereas, major corporations such as Alaska Airlines, American Airlines, Disney, Starbucks, and McDonald's have taken strides to limit their plastic straw use;⁶
- **7.** Whereas, there are several environmentally friendly alternative options to plastic straws for the food service industry, such as paper, bamboo, or other sustainably sourced plant products;

Therefore, be it resolved that the Alaska Association of Student Governments opposes the continued use of single use plastic straws in the Food Service Industry in the State of Alaska.
