

## Alaska Association of Student Governments Resolution #17 Balancing E-hall pass Submitted by: Max Mullenberg and Lehansa Fernando October 14, 2023

Be it Resolved by the Alaska Association of Student Governments that: The hall pass is balanced between paper passes and the E-Hall pass.

- 1. Whereas, most of the students and staff don't like the E-Hall pass;
- 2. **Whereas,** the E-Hall pass interrupts lessons during the day;
- 3. **Whereas**, according to Victoria Williams, "It takes to long to set up the destinations for teachers" meaning teachers have to pause their lessons;
- 4. Whereas, the E-Hall pass only gives students five minutes to leave the classroom;
- 5. **Whereas,** the use of E-Hall Passes has been observed to disrupt the flow of lessons throughout the school day, impacting the overall learning environment;
- 6. **Whereas**, technical glitches in the E-Hall Pass system, including inaccurate timers and unexpected stops, compromise its reliability and effectiveness;
- 7. **Whereas,** when students used paper hall passes it was easier for teachers to see that the pass was still out of the classroom

Therefore, be it resolved that the Alaska Association of Student Governments supports that the E-Hall pass is balanced with a paper hall pass.

**Action Statement:** if passed by the General Assembly of AASG, Lathrop's Executive Board will bring the resolution to the school board superintendent Dr. Luke Meinert.
