A Resolution to Allow Exemptions for the Alaska History Granted by Alaska Admin Code (AAC) 06.075 Section D in the Fairbanks North Star Borough School District (FNSBSD)

Submitted by Hutchison High School Student Council

Submitted: April 25, 2018

Be it resolved by the Alaska Association of Student Governments that:

- 1. Whereas,** AAC 06.075 Section D states a student who “(1) transfers into an Alaska public school after the student's second year of high school; or (2) has already successfully completed a high school state history course from another state” is not required to meet the provisions requiring students to complete one half-unit of credit in Alaska history;
- 2. Whereas,** FNSBSD Does not comply with these exemptions for graduation requirements;
- 3. Whereas,** FNSBSD covers an area with two sizeable military bases;
- 4. Whereas,** 25% of students within FNSBSD are connected to the military;
- 5. Whereas,** students in military families tend to move frequently, potentially causing difficulty meeting changing graduation requirements if they move between states;

Therefore, be it resolved that the Alaska Association of Student Governments supports that students in FNSBSD that meet the exemption requirements for Alaska history granted by the state of Alaska are not required to take Alaska Studies.


