

Alaska Association of Student Government Resolution #6

Increasing Language Options at Tri-Valley School Submitted by: Tri-Valley Student Council Submitted: 4/23/2025

Be it Resolved by the Alaska Association of Student Governments That:

- 1. **Whereas,** at Tri-Valley School (TVS), there is only one option for foreign language taught in person, which is Spanish, and offers Spanish 1 and Spanish 2;
- 2. **Whereas,** students can also take a foreign language virtually, either through an online college-level or Acellus curriculum or with a teacher at Anderson School;
- 3. **Whereas,** immediate in-person feedback is most beneficial for improving one's pronunciation, grammar, and vocabulary. In addition, having a structured, guided curriculum forces individuals to learn at a steady pace and improve gradually;¹
- 4. **Whereas,** learning different languages helps children develop cognitive skills, and enhances their problem-solving abilities, and fosters empathy and cultural understanding;²
- 5. **Whereas,** it also opens up broader communication opportunities and can lead to better job prospects in the future;²
- 6. **Whereas,** the Denali Borough has a vast summer tourism industry, which includes many visitors from around the world who speak different languages;
- 7. **Whereas,** various Tri-Valley students have been able to take advantage of their foreign language education and apply it to their summer jobs within the tourism industry;
- 8. **Whereas,** 75.9% of high school students at TVS have taken at least one year of foreign language, with 100% of those respondents having taken Spanish 1 and/or Spanish 2;³
- 9. **Whereas**, when surveyed, 89.7% of Tri-Valley high schoolers said that they believe more foreign language options should be offered at TVS, with an additional 10.3% saying they were unsure, and 0% in disagreement;³

- 10. **Whereas,** if more foreign language options were offered at TVS, 69% of students said that they would take one, 17.2% said they were not sure, and 13.8% said they would not;³
- 11. **Whereas,** if more foreign language options were offered, 12 students would like to take French, 7 would take ASL, 4 would take German, 3 would take Italian, 2 each would take Portuguese, Japanese, Chinese, Russian, or Mandarin, and 1 each would like to take Norwegian or Spanish 3;³
- 12. **Whereas**, some colleges and universities have different foreign language credit requirements for graduating high school seniors to enroll;
- **13.** Whereas, having more foreign language options would be beneficial for students trying to fit the credit requirements;
- 14. **Whereas,** we have many bilingual community members in the Denali Borough whom we could ask to teach a short elective class, most likely with a small stipend;
- 15. **Whereas**, we have had several community volunteers who have taught optional elective classes after the end of the school day, such as Welding & Small Engines;
- 16. **Whereas**, we will also advocate to the Denali Borough School District School Board on expanding bilingual educator recruitment;
- 17. **Whereas,** we can also help to promote information about the online and virtual foreign language class options that exist already;

Therefore, be it resolved that the Alaska Association of Student Governments supports the Tri-Valley Student Council in advocating for the implementation and increased promotion of additional foreign language instruction at Tri-Valley School.

Action Statement: If passed by the general assembly of AASG, this resolution will be brought to the Tri-Valley School Principal, as well as the Denali Borough School District School Board for their consideration and further recommendation of expanding bilingual educator recruitment.
