

Alaska Association of Student Governments Resolution #7 Updated Saw Equipment In Alaskan Schools Submitted by: Skyler Smith

Submitted: April 9, 2019

Be it Resolved by the Alaska Association of Student Governments that:

1. Whereas, statistics show over 30,000 injuries resulting from a table saw occur annually in the United States;¹

2. Whereas, of the estimated 30,000, 12.4% of them involve minors in school woodshop classes;³

3. Whereas, finger reattachment isn't always possible and is dependent on timing and medical staff capabilities;

4. Whereas, proper care for amputation victims can't be supported by local clinics and requires transfer to either Anchorage Providence or Seattle, Washington depending on medical staff capabilities;

5. Whereas, Alaska has an estimated population of 735,795 and of that 239,204 live in rural communities around the state;⁸

6. Whereas, the total approximate cost of replantation surgery is over \$40,000 while amputation surgeries average over \$15,000, not including hospital stay, medication, and travel;³

7. Whereas, a student in Oregon sued his school district in 2012 for more than 5 million dollars because of a lack of education about the table saw, outdated equipment and medical bills;⁵

8. Whereas, a student in Washington received approximately \$70,000 after suing the school for an injury caused by a lack of education on equipment and outdated equipment in 2006;⁶

9. Whereas, table saws with SawStop technology have been created to prevent injuries from occurring;²

10. Whereas, by having the SawStop installed in woodshops it could prevent minors amputating appendages due to the advanced technology;²

11. Whereas, a grant exists between \$10,000 and \$50,000 available to all schools in the state of Alaska that provides money for Vocational Ed class's needs;⁴

12. Whereas, the Carl D. Perkins grant will *not* be cut if Governer Dunleavy's proposed budget cuts go through;⁹

13. Whereas, the grant can be used to purchase the SawStop table saw and install it;⁴

14. Whereas, one of the strategic priorities of the DEEDs' Alaska Education Challenge is to "Promote safety and well-being";⁷

Therefore, be it resolved that the Alaska Association of Student Governments supports Alaskan schools prioritizing the upgrade of school shop table saws to include SawStop technology in individual school's CTE budgeting processes.
