# Kotzebue (Region 1)

## Skate Night Date Night

- Kotzebue hosted a roller rink fundraiser in their school gym for middle and high school students
- The proceeds went to Putyuk Children's Home, which supports children without safe housing and foster placement
- They raised \$435 which helped fund the children's birthday outings, basketball games, etc



# Sitka High School (Region 5)

## Lifting Spirit in the Community

- During the holidays, Sitka High wrote over 40 appreciation cards for people like bus drivers, hospital, etc
- They also visited a local pioneer home twice, where they spent time with senior citizens
- They baked around 60 cookies, sang carols, and played games together



# Skagway School (Region 5)

## Community Cake Walk

- They hosted a baked goods walk to help raise money for a family whose house had recently burned down
- They also invited NHS to get as many people involved as possible in the fundraiser
- Through their combined efforts they raised \$846 that went straight to the family



# Tri - Valley (Region 2)

## Neighbor to Neighbor Food Drive

- Tri-Valley student council organized a school wide food drive to support their local “neighbor to neighbor” program that provides monthly food boxes to families in need
- They set a new record by collecting 2,771 pounds of food
- To encourage participation, they gave an opportunity to pie a teacher in the face and shave their principal’s beard + head if a substantial amount of food was collected



# North Pole #1 (Region 6)

## Clothing Drive

- North Pole student council collected over 500 pounds of clothes
- They donated the clothes to the Fairbanks Fire and Rescue to give to those that are in need



# North Pole #2 (Region 6)

## Elementary School Dance

- North Pole's student council assisted North Pole Elementary with planning two of their dances
- North Pole Elementary greatly appreciated the help and hopes they come back next year





# Tok #1 (Region 2)

## Drug Free Ribbon Challenge

- During their January basketball tournament, Tok student council partnered with Tanana Chief Council's drug prevention team to host an anti-drug ribbon challenge
- Inspired by AASG challenges, students completed tasks to earn 10 ribbons and enter a prize drawing, with over 50 students participating
- They also collaborated with TCC to provide free CPR training, certifying 10 students and 12 staff members



# Tok #2 (Region 2)

## Fentanyl Prevention

- Inspired by a presentation at the Delta AASG conference, Tok Student Council secured over \$5000 in local donations to support the AK Fentanyl Response Project
- They hosted a community presentation on the dangers of fentanyl, featuring speakers from the project, an Anchorage Police captain, DEA agents, and local troopers



## Tok #3 (Region 2)

### Hardaway Learning

- Tok Student Council partnered with Northway School administrators to bring Hardaway Learning (an Alaska-based program led by Derrick Moore) to their schools
- The program focuses on goal setting and purpose to help prevent substance abuse and unhealthy behaviors
- Middle and high school students engaged with Derrick Moore, set personal goals, and reflected on their choices and habits
